



WORSHIP NOTES

The Paschal Candle

Christ the King Sunday marks the end of the liturgical season that follows Pentecost. Today we focus on the victory of the crucified and risen Christ. We look back to Easter and forward to the coming of Christ.

On Easter Sunday, we lit the Paschal Candle to represent the new light of the resurrection, which banishes the death and darkness of Good Friday. Today we will remove the Paschal Candle from the Sanctuary.

With this act, we recognize that we remain imperfect people in an imperfect world. We acknowledge that God's work is not yet done. And we prepare for the season of Advent, during which we will wait once again for the coming of Christ.

Music

This morning's Offertory Anthem is Philip Stopford's *Fifth Avenue Te Deum*, a vibrant work for choir and organ commissioned by the Fifth Avenue congregation in honor of Ryan Jackson's tenth anniversary as Director of Music and Fine Arts Ministries. This piece was premiered during our Homecoming service last year, and has quickly become a favorite piece in our choir's repertoire.

In the words of the composer, Philip Stopford: "It has been my great pleasure to compose a new work for Ryan Jackson and the Choir of Fifth Avenue Presbyterian Church. As with any sacred work, the job of the composer is to express, through new music, the text being set. With the *Te Deum*, we have an ancient hymn of praise, often used at the conclusion of a great service, such as the Coronation of King Charles III at Westminster Abbey. My new *Te Deum* reflects the same text with music influenced by the sights and sounds of New York City—bright lights, rhythmic energy, Broadway-style melodies, and all the joy of the city that never sleeps. I really hope you enjoy this ancient text wrapped up in a new sound."
