





WORSHIP NOTES

This morning's Offertory Anthem is a lovely setting of the ancient Advent hymn, *Conditor alme siderum* ("Creator of the Stars of Night"). Its text dates back to the 7th century. While of uncertain authorship, the text is one of the great treasures of hymnody: in just five classical quatrains (three of which are in today's setting), the writer gives a complete overview of salvation history, powerful for its simplicity and economy: Christ himself is the creator of the stars of night, the light of all believers, who came to save the world. He was born of the Virgin Mary and now all creation acknowledges him as Lord and awaits his return. The hymn is traditionally sung to Sarum Plainsong, Mode IV, which is the melody heard this morning. This chant dates back to the 9th century when the Sarum tradition originated at the Cathedral of Salisbury in the UK.


