



In your mercy, forgive what we have been, help us amend what we are, and direct what we shall be, so that we may delight in your will, and walk in your ways, to the glory of your holy name.





WORSHIP NOTES

Nicholas White's *How Far Is It to Bethlehem* is a tender and introspective setting of Frances Chesterton's gentle poem. With its warm harmonies and elegant phrasing, White captures the simplicity and wonder of the Nativity, inviting both singers and listeners into a quiet moment of reflection.

Eleanor Daley's *Gabriel's Message* offers a radiant reimagining of Sabine Baring-Gould's poetic account of the Annunciation. Known for her gift of creating expressive and lyrical choral music, Daley infuses the angel Gabriel's proclamation with shimmering harmonies and rhythmic vitality. The interplay of flowing melodic lines and unexpected shifts in meter brings the story to life with grace and a sense of joyous anticipation.

Bob Chilcott's *Mid-Winter* transforms Christina Rossetti's evocative poem into a musical gem of warmth and intimacy. Chilcott's rich choral writing and the understated piano accompaniment capture the poignant imagery of the text, weaving a musical atmosphere both intimate and radiant. Together, these three anthems showcase the creative brilliance of women poets brought to life by contemporary composers.
