

#### WORSHIP NOTES

This morning's Anthem, *Set Me As a Seal*, was composed by René Clausen, an esteemed American composer, conductor of The Concordia Choir, and professor of music at Concordia College in Moorhead, Minnesota. Clausen's works are widely performed and recorded, and his exceptional contributions to choral music have earned numerous accolades, including three Grammy Awards for the album *Life & Breath: Choral Works by René Clausen* at the 55th Grammy Awards in 2013. *Set Me As a Seal* was written during a deeply painful time in Clausen's life. Reflecting on its genesis, Clausen shared:

"Some time ago my wife suffered four consecutive miscarriages. She finally carried a child into the fifth month, all was well, and the doctor suggested she undergo an amniocentesis, as she was past 35. During the procedure the doctor inserted the needle accidentally into the umbilical cord, and killed the baby in her womb. As she was so far along, she had to deliver the dead baby normally. For some reason I will never understand, the hospital placed her in a birthing room on the maternity floor, directly next to the nursery. As she underwent the labor through the night, we heard the crying babies next door in the nursery.

"I wrote *Set Me As a Seal* the next evening. Normally, when I am asked about the 'inspiration' process, I laugh and deny inspiration in favor of work and effort. In this case, however, I just sat down and wrote the piece. I don't know what is wrapped up inside these few, simple notes. I can say actually very little about the piece. Whenever I return to it, however, I am struck by the phrase 'for love is strong as death,' because when I wrote it my actual feeling was 'for love is stronger than death;' abiding, all-encompassing love absorbs even the pain of death. If the piece is about anything, it is about the simple but powerful conviction of permanent love that seeks to overflow the boundary between life and death."

For the Offertory Anthem, we turn to My Soul's Been Anchored in the Lord, one of the most celebrated spiritual arrangements by Moses Hogan, one of America's foremost composers and arrangers of choral music. Known for his distinctive and masterful settings, Hogan's works are beloved worldwide for their expressive beauty and stylistic sophistication. Although his life was tragically cut short at the age of 45 due to a brain tumor in 2003, Hogan's enduring legacy continues to inspire through his remarkable contributions to 20th-century American choral music.
