
Parking


Scripture Lesson

John 20:1-18

Early on the first day of the week, while it was still dark, Mary Magdalene came to the tomb and saw that the stone had been removed from the tomb. So she ran and went to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one whom Jesus loved, and said to them, "They have taken the Lord out of the tomb, and we do not know where they have laid him." Then Peter and the other disciple set out and went toward the tomb. The two were running together, but the other disciple outran Peter and reached the tomb first. He bent down to look in and saw the linen wrappings lying there, but he did not go in. Then Simon Peter came, following him, and went into the tomb. He saw the linen wrappings lying there, and the cloth that had been on Jesus' head, not lying with the linen wrappings but rolled up in a place by itself. Then the other disciple, who reached the tomb first, also went in, and he saw and believed; for as yet they did not understand the scripture, that he must rise from the dead. Then the disciples returned to their homes.

But Mary stood weeping outside the tomb. As she wept, she bent over to look into the tomb; and she saw two angels in white, sitting where the body of Jesus had been lying, one at the head and the other at the feet. They said to her, "Woman, why are you weeping?" She said to them, "They have taken away my Lord, and I do not know where they have laid him." When she had said this, she turned around and saw Jesus standing there, but she did not know that it was Jesus. Jesus said to her, "Woman, why are you weeping? Whom are you looking for?" Supposing him to be the gardener, she said to him, "Sir, if you have carried him away, tell me where you have laid him, and I will take him away." Jesus said to her, "Mary!" She turned and said to him in Hebrew, "Rabbouni!" (which means Teacher). Jesus said to her, "Do not hold on to me, because I have not yet ascended to the Father. But go to my brothers and say to them, 'I am ascending to my Father and your Father, to my God and your God.'" Mary Magdalene went and announced to the disciples, "I have seen the Lord"; and she told them that he had said these things to her.

The Paschal Candle

"The Light of Christ!" "Thanks be to God!" Each year at Easter, these words pierce the air as we begin worship with the procession of a large, lit candle. This candle is the Paschal Candle, sometimes called the Easter Candle or Christ Candle; its name comes from *pasach*, the Hebrew word for Passover. Congregations may have different Easter celebrations and very different-looking paschal candles, but the meaning and symbols are universal.

Following the period of darkness that began on Good Friday, Christians light a new candle on Easter morning, signaling Christ's banishment of death and darkness. This tall, white candle (made from bee's wax) represents Christ's steadfast presence in our midst.

Sunday, April 27: CREDO | Mothers of the Messiah

This year, our clergy will explore the matrilineal ancestry of Jesus in the Gospel of Matthew, focusing on Tamar, Rahab, Ruth, and Bathsheba. These women, from diverse backgrounds, demonstrated extraordinary strength, resilience, and courage. Their stories offer profound insights into faith, redemption, and God's grace. The Rev. Dr. Jonah So opens the series with Tamar (Genesis 38), who courageously confronted injustice when denied the protection owed by her father-in-law, Judah. In a bold move, she compelled him to acknowledge his wrongdoing, securing her family's place in Jesus' lineage. Tamar's story challenges us to consider courage, justice, and God's surprising work through human lives. Each CREDO lecturer will also join the Crossroads Podcast to share reflections on the Mothers of the Messiah. Join us after service at 12:30 pm in Bonnell Hall. Refreshments will be served.


